

### **MEETING AGENDA**

The New Jersey Law Revision Commission is continuing to comply with changes to New Jersey's Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act, Executive Orders issued by the Governor of the State of New Jersey, and recommendations issued by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) regarding "social distancing." - Receivership Act -- Consideration of a Draft Final Report proposing a modification of the language of N.J.S. 2A:42-117 so that it is consistently permissive as discussed in *Mfrs. and Traders Tr. Co. v. Marina Bay Towers Urban Renewal II*, LP, 2019 WL 5395937 (App. Div. 2019). Report
- 2. "Personal Conveyance" in N.J.S. 39:4-92.4 Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report recommending modification of N.J.S. 39:4-92.4 to replace the term "personal conveyance" with the term "vulnerable user of a roadway." Report
- **3. Inmate** -- Consideration of a Memorandum proposing a project to consider eliminating the term "inmate" from the New Jersey statutes and replacing it with updated language where appropriate. <u>Memo</u>
