- 1. <u>Standard Form Contracts</u> Consideration of a Revised Draft Final Report on Standard Form Contracts. Also included are two Memoranda, one of which briefly discusses the proposed Restatement of the Law of Consumer Contracts. <u>Report Memo Memo Re ALI</u>
- 2. Definition of "Widow" Consideration of a Draft Tentative Report proposing a definition of widow in N.J.S. 54:4–3.30. Report
- 3. <u>Local Lands and Building Laws Bidding</u> Consideration of a Memorandum proposing a project to clarify whether the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S. 40A:11-1 et seq.) applies to the acquisition of real property, capital improvement, or personal property by a County, or municipality, pursuant to the Local Lands and Building Laws, specifically N.J.S. 40A:12-5(a)(3). <u>Memo</u>
- 4. <u>Notice by Publication</u> Consideration of a Memorandum proposing a project to clarify Municipal Notice by Publication Statutes (N.J.S. 40:49-2(a), (d); and, N.J.S. 40A:12A-6)) and the "qualified newspaper" requirement (N.J.S. 35:1-2.2.). <u>Memo</u>
- 5. Modification of Unemployment Compensation Law Consideration of a Memorandum proposing a project regarding the 2015 amendment to N.J.S. 43:21-5(a) et seq. to clarify whether it can retroactively apply to cases in which plaintiffs do not receive unemployment benefits after leaving a job for medical reasons as discussed in *Ardan v. Board of Review*, 231 N.J. 589 (2018). Memo
- 6. <u>Juvenile Detention</u> Consideration of a Memorandum concerning a potential project to modify the Juvenile Justice Code in light of constitutional infirmities regarding the incarceration of juveniles with developmental disabilities as discussed *in State in Interest of T.C.*, 454 N.J.Super. 189 (App. Div. 2018). Memo
- 7. <u>Juvenile Megan's Law offenders</u> Consideration of a Memorandum concerning a potential project to modify N.J.S. 2C:7-2 to address the constitutionality of barring certain sex-offending adjudicated delinquents from relief of permanent registration requirements, as discussed in *State in Interest of C.K.*, 233 N.J. 44 (N.J. 2018). <u>Memo</u>
- 8. <u>Parsonage Exemption</u> Consideration of a Memorandum proposing the modification of Title 54:3-6 to create a statutory definition of "officiating clergyman" in order to create clarity in regards to parsonage exemptions as discussed in *Clover Hill Reformed Church v. Twp. of Hillsborough*, 2018 WL 1478024 (N.J. Tax Ct. Mar. 23, 2018). Memo
